The Referral Route

When to refer - As soon as you have a concern about a child presenting with SEMH needs, we recommend you complete a referral.

How to refer - Send the referral form to pitreferrals@salford.gov.uk or call us on 0161 921 2653 or 0161 921 1830.

What you can expect - You can expect to hear from us within 48 hours of sending the referral form. We aim to complete an initial visit within the following 3 weeks. It is important at that initial visit that we see the child during a normal school day.
